



Trip to Paris!

On Monday 22nd May, at 4am, 38 excited children boarded a coach to Paris. We arrived at our beautiful chateau on Monday afternoon and enjoyed an action-packed week. Not only did the children complete a whole range of activities on site, including plenty of splashing around in the outdoor heated pool, but they also had the opportunity to visit a French market and test out their French language skills, climb the Eiffel Tower, take a ride on Bateaux Parisien and visit the wonderful Disneyland Paris. Whole School "Walk to School" Week!

Fulfen will be holding its 'Walk to School' week from **Monday 12**th **to Friday 16**th **June**, where we are encouraging as many pupils as possible to walk to school, rather than arriving by car.
