Our iPad scheme has been running successfully for over 4 years now and our visitors were very impressed with the work the children are doing and also with their attitude to learning and their impeccable manners!

Free School Meals – are you eligible to apply?

Amid the ongoing hardships from the rising cost of living, some families may find that their circumstances have changed recently. Parents claiming some benefits can claim free school meals for any of their children who are registered at a Staffordshire school and who would normally be at school at lunch time.

School meals are a good way to ensure that your child eats well at lunchtime and you can save yourself time and money. You can only apply online if you meet the low income criteria. Remember, you can only claim free school meals if your child is going to be in Reception year or above when the meals begin. <u>https://www.staffordshire.gov.uk/Education/Educational-awardsbenefits/FreeSchoolMeals/Applyonline.aspx</u>

After completing an application, you can print a copy of the confirmation page to give to the school for meals to start immediately. If you are unable to print you can still make your application online, but will need to wait for us to advise the school before you can start to receive the free school meals.

HAF - have you booked?

For children who already get free school meals, there are free activities on during the school holidays. You can book up to 16 half day (or 8 full day sessions for free!)

Focus on Online Safety!

Is your child on Tik Tok?

It can be easy for children and young people to come across inappropriate content on the TikTok app. Because TikTok uses algorithms to show users new content, it's easy for young people to come across inappropriate or upsetting videos. The platform also has communication features that allow users to privately message each other which could put your child at risk of being contacted by someone they don't know. Tik Tok is rated as 13+ and is not suitable for Primary aged children to use unsupervised.

What parents need to know about

AGE-INAPPROPRIATE CONTENT

While TikTok's "Following" feed only displays videos from users someone follows, "For You" is a stream of clips based on their previously watched content. Most videos on a child's "For You" feed will therefore be light-hearted and amusing, but it could potentially surface something unsuitable. TikTok's guidelines prohibit the sharing of illegal or inappropriate content, but the sheer volume of uploads mean they aren't manually monitored and vetted.

DANGEROUS CHALLENGES

Due to TikTok's immense popularity, some young people have unfortunately been influenced by videos challenging them to perform harmful, criminal or even deadly acts. One extreme example was the 'blackout' trend, which encouraged users to hold their breath until they passed out from a lack of oxygen. It led to two families filing lawsuits against TikTok over the tragic deaths of their children.

CONTACT WITH STRANGERS

With around 1.1 billion users globally, the potential for contact from strangers on TikTok is high – especially as accounts created by over–16s (or youngsters using a false date of birth) are set to public by default. This not only means that someone's profile is visible to everyone else on the app: it also lets their videos be suggested to others and enables anyone to comment on them or download them.

IN-APP SPENDING

TikTok is free, but users have the option to buy TikTok coins, which can be used to purchase emojis in the app. These emojis are then sent as rewards (retaining their monetary value) to other users for videos they've created. Coin bundles range from £9.99 to an eye-watering £99; TikTok's policy is that they can't be bought by under-18s, but it's possible to bypass this with a fake birthdate.

ADDICTIVE NATURE

TikTok can be addictive, especially for young people: compulsive repeated use can interfere with sleep patterns and be a distraction from other activities. The platform recently introduced default usage time limits of 60 and 100 minutes for new members under 18 (in the UK, children with TikTok average 102 minutes per day on the app), but these restrictions can easily be removed in the settings.

TIKTOK NOW


Introduced in late 2022, the 'TikTok Now' feature lets users post a daily video or photo at the exact same time as their friends. Users receive a synchronised notification at a random time of day, giving them three minutes to take a video or real-time photo. This addition can not only be a distraction to young people but could lead to them inadvertently sharing private content such as their location.

Garden Update!

Our Story So Far...

Fulfen has always had a school garden, but over the last few years it has been a little unloved! Last year Izzy, a year 6 pupil, won a competition to design a Peace Pole Garden. The competition was organised by The Rotary Club and once we saw her design come to life, we decided to give our garden an overhaul. A lot of hard work produced an outdoor learning environment that the whole school can use.

In April, we ran our first Saturday morning Gardening Club and after 6 weeks our garden really began to take shape. We have added 3 small allotment plots and have bought 4 potting benches.

Everything we are planting and growing can be used to make soup. We will be harvesting our vegetables in September and the children will be making their own vegetable soup!

Where are we now?

We are currently running an after-school garden club on a Wednesday for years 3 & 4 and will continue to run clubs for different year groups from September. Here are our Wednesday Gardeners holding the 'apple bird feeders' they've made. This term they've learned about worms, pollinators, water conservation and composting.



What we've planted so far:





During our last Gardening Club, we harvested our lovely radish. These have been grown from seeds that were planted in a piece of recycled guttering.

The children all had a chance to dig up some radish, as they were now ready for harvesting. The children thought it was like digging for gold!

Next Steps and our Fulfen Garden Appeal

We would really like Polytunnel so that we can grow our own fruit, vegetable and bedding plants from seed and also have a sheltered outdoor space that we can use during the winter.

We are aiming to grow and then sell produce to parents and staff; this would be a wonderful experience for the children to run their own small enterprise!



Let's Talk Chickens...



We are working with the British Hen Welfare Trust to re-home some ex-battery hens. We would like to get this set up over the summer holidays. We are looking to re-home 3 hens to start with. This will be a wonderful project for the whole school to get involved with. Having hens will develop team working, a sense of personal responsibility and support a huge range of curriculum aligned skills. This will bring different age groups, staff, parents and the local community together and enrich school life in positive and unexpected ways.

As you can imagine the set-up costs and ongoing cost for this project are quite significant. We estimate that the one-off cost would be approximately £500 - £600, which would include building a hen house and secure run and then there will be ongoing costs for food, bedding and vet fees.

The advantages for the school are endless, we will teach the children how to care for the hens and hopefully be able to sell the fresh eggs to families and teachers!
