




In Year 4, children deconstructed "On The Move Again" by Michael Rosen and put it back together and examined how the meaning had


More Poetry - The Highwayman

- Thursday Y5/6 Sportshall Athletics (competitive) 20 places


There will also be more exciting teacher-led clubs (such as choir, art and dance) too! Relevant year groups will be emailed about the clubs available before half term.
