




Feel-Good-Fridays!

By engaging in hands-on activities such as woodwork, sewing, cooking, and working with pneumatic systems, our pupils are encouraged to think critically and come up with innovative solutions to challenges they may face. STEAM week 2024

Early in June, children at Fulfen celebrated our annual STEAM week. During this week, we aim to inspire inquiry and curiosity to empower our pupils to ask thought-provoking questions that promote creativity and exploration, and make connections to the real world.

We kickstarted the week with our STEAM dress up day and we saw some incredible costumes: from artists to chefs, explorers to mechanics, vets to palaeontologists, we covered every aspect of STEAM.

During the course of the week, every year group had visits or workshops to attend and we were thrilled to collaborate with Chase Terrace Academy on a number of opportunities. Early Years, Year 1 and Year 2 welcomed visitors from South Staffs Water to learn all about water waste and how they can work together to help save the planet. Our local police team visited with cars and a riot van – speaking to many classes across the school and Y5 and Y6 made the trip up to Chase Terrace Academy to take part in coding workshops. Finishing the week off, the science department visited from Chase Terrace Academy and treated the Y6 children to both a chemistry and a biology lesson, the latter involving dissection! Children were also invited to demonstrations by our peripatetic music teachers, who showcased the violin and guitar.





